# KING - Knowledge for INtegration Governance

The KING project's objective is to elaborate a report on the **state of play** of migrant integration in Europe through an interdisciplinary approach and to provide decision- and policy-makers with **evidence-based recommendations** on the design of migrant integration-related policies and on the way they should be articulated between different policy-making levels of governance.

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## 1. INTRODUCTION

This bibliography is the result of a systematic exploration of the scientific literature on local integration policies of European cities. It tries to cover not only the regularly published literature but also the grey literature, i.e. research documents and case studies that are part of research projects, but are not widely published. This has steered the process of exploration and the form of reporting: The literature will be presented by research project and the research projects are ordered in three larger categories according to their funding source. A fourth section is added containing a general bibliography. Specifically, this report covers:

- a) identified EU-funded large scale comparative research projects on the topic of local integration policy from the Fourth and Fifth Framework Programme of the DG Research of the European Commission (reported under section 1);
- b) identified EU-funded large scale comparative research projects on the topic of local integration policy from the Sixth and Seventh Framework Programme of the DG Research (reported under section 2);
- c) 20 research projects funded by other DGs of the European Commission or by other supranational organisations that have (parts of) integration policies in their portfolio (reported under section 3);
- d) a general bibliography including strictly academic research as well as single publications produced and published by actors in the policy sphere (reported under section 4).
